



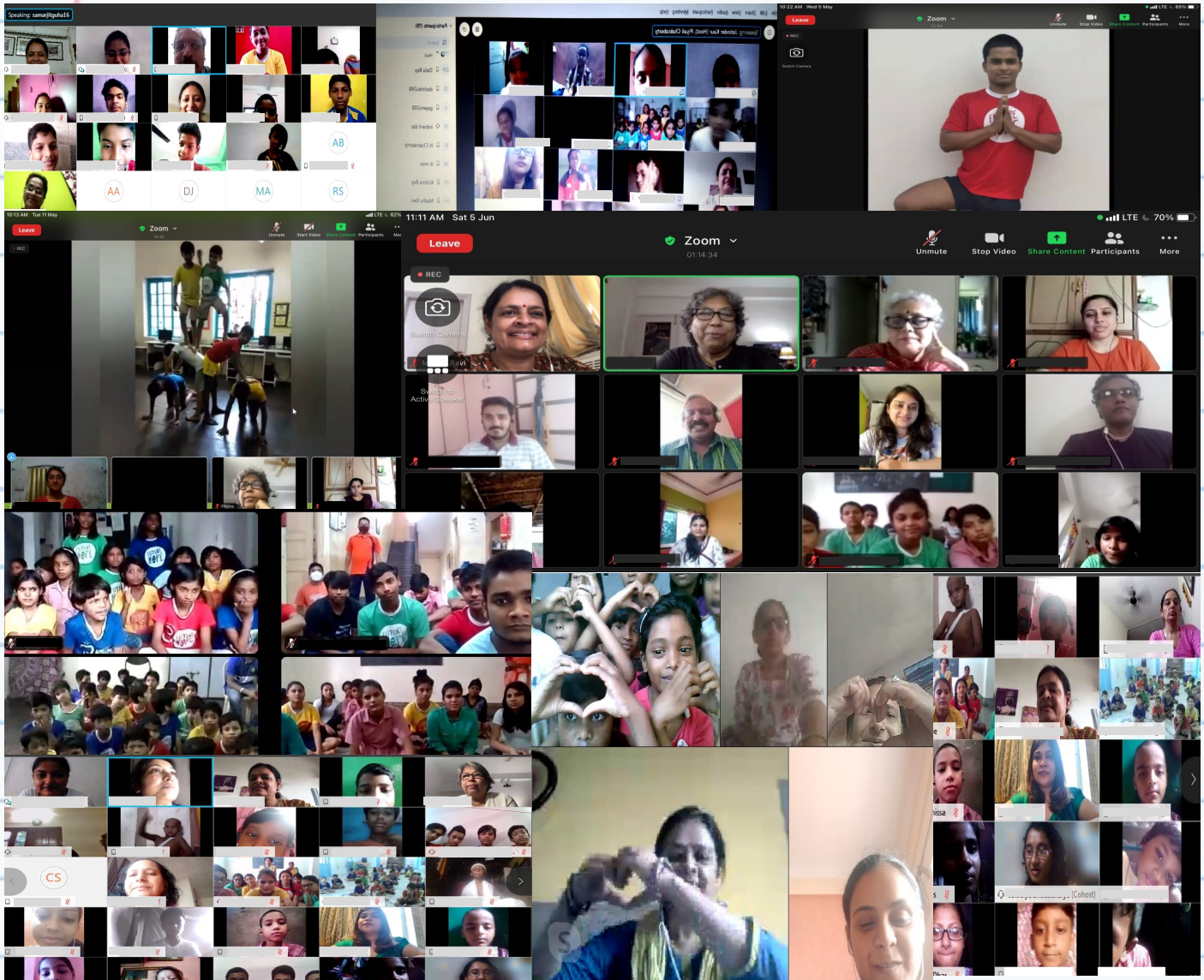

ONLINE CLASSES

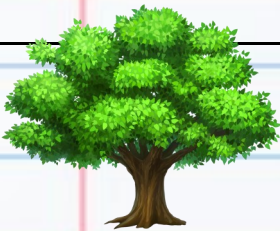

Books open magical doors that lead to magical places.



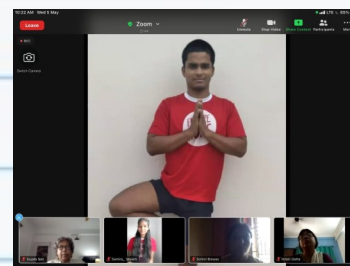

ANNUAL DRAMA 2021

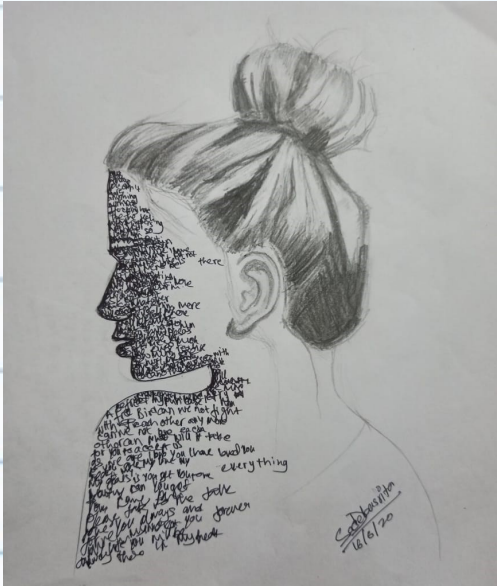

The people from difficult financial background were not able to afford basic things like rice, wheat, pulses, etc. due to rise in prices during this Pandemic. Many people also lost their jobs. So, my school, Future Hope decided to distribute ration to those places where people needed food to eat. Future Hope also gave rations to their students and their families so that they had basic food. Even I got ration from my school and It helped me and my family in many ways. 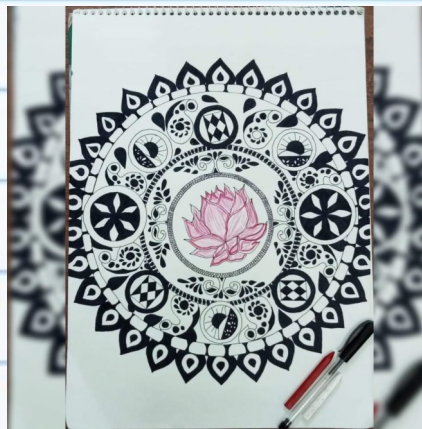

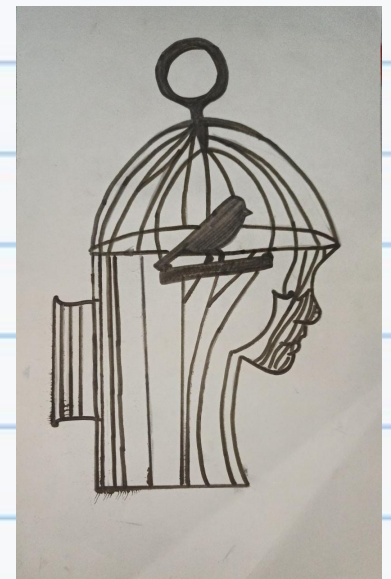
